



This par four requires two long, accurate shots to reach the green in regulation. The fairway is guarded by bunkers, trees and Mr. Dye's signature railroad ties.

The Ties



A very accurate shot is required on this difficult par three. Bunkers guard this very deep green on almost every side, so club selection is also critical.

Blind Bogey

A wide open fairway invites you to wait away on your tee shot. Be sure to avoid the large bunkers guarding the right side of the fairway. While the left side is wide open, tee shots placed on this side leave you a blind approach shot over trees, a creek and bunkers.

Parotana

The view from this tee will take your breath away. You must try and focus. A tee shot over a deep pot bunker, and approach shot that must carry the lake will require all of your attention.

The Dunes

A generous fairway allows room to avoid the waste area to the left that defines this hole. With danger in play for the entire length of the hole, you are encouraged to stay within the playing areas to avoid disaster.

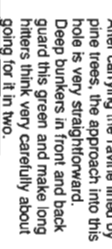

Toughest Four

This number one handicap hole is not only long, but is also flanked by the waste area accompanied by towering pine trees, more fairway bunkers and out of bounds to the right. By the way, there is a deep pond and a complex of pot bunkers by the green to make sure your approach shot is as demanding as your drive.



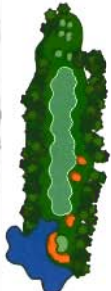

Willow Creek

Only the very best tee shots are rewarded with a makeable birdie putt. This dramatically undulating green requires pinpoint accuracy to get a shot close to the hole. Beware of the steep slope at the front of the green.

Pine Valley

After carrying the fairway lined by pine trees, the approach into this hole is very straightforward. Deep bunkers in front and back guard this green and make long hitters think very carefully about going for it in two.

The Turn

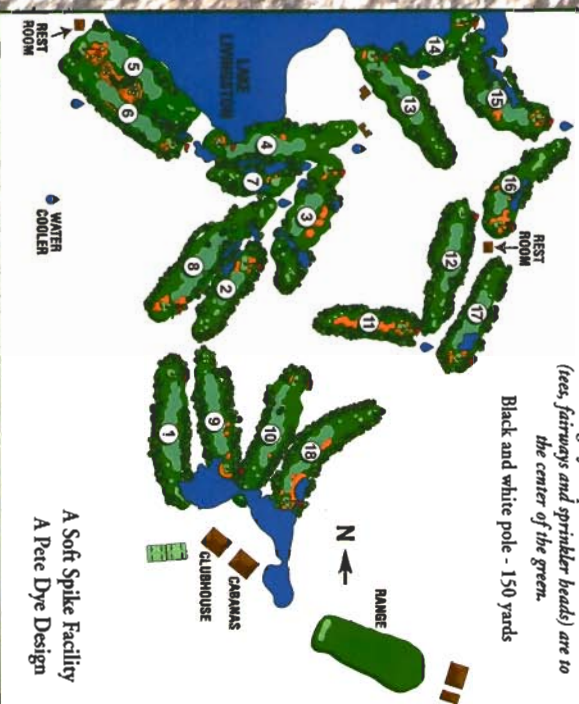
Make sure your tee shot finds the fairway, or you'll have challenges approaching this well-guarded green. A bunker surrounds the green on three sides, and approaches from the right side of the fairway must contend with the pond.

RULES

- USGA rules govern play except where modified by local rules.
 - Ball drops are provided on holes 3, 8 and 14.
 - Out of bounds is defined by white stakes and paved roads.
 - Carts must remain on the path on all par 3's.
 - Keep carts on the path around tees and greens.
 - Each player must have a set of clubs.
 - Dress Code: Collared shirt required and thank you for not wearing denim.
 - All food and beverage must be purchased from Waterrwood National.
 - Private coolers are not allowed.
 - You must have a valid drivers license to operate carts.
 - All players use the course and facilities at their own risk and must comply with all rules and regulations.
- PLEASE -
- Replace divots.
 - Repair ball marks on greens.
 - Rake bunkers.
 - Keep pace with the group in front of you and play ready golf.

Yardages from permanent markers (tees, fairways and sprinkler heads) are to the center of the green.
