WATERWOOD LOTS SOLD

Frank Markey and Terry McLachlan of Investor Land Services LLC (ILS) came to Waterwood from Dallas to announce that they had closed on the 513 NRPI lots foreclosed on by San Jacinto County. The properties were sold for the taxes due.

ILS is a “Limited Liability Corporation” (llc). The Texas Secretary of State’s web site shows Dennis Ardizzoni, Frank Markey and Terry McLachlan as Directors of ILS. The treasurer is Dennis Ardizzoni and ILS lists two managers Frank Markey and Terry McLachlan.



Mr. Ardizzoni is the principal economic and financial advisor for DFW Broadband. He is a graduate of Bowling Green State and received his masters degree from the University of Connecticut. He worked 32 years as a U. S. Treasury Department as a National Bank Examiner.

Mr. Markey has a BS degree from Texas A&M. He has been a commercial real estate executive and investor with over 25 years in the industry.

Mr. McLachlan graduated from Auckland University of Technology. He has been a partner of ILS since March of 2006.

Mr. Markey stated, “It was close today, May 16, 2011 or loose the properties.”. They further advised, “They would attempt to sell off ‘prime lots’, and try to interest local developers into developing smaller sections of the properties.”

ILS has sold properties on “e-bay” in the past. Their “e-bay” statement advises “Investor Land Services specializes in locating and purchasing bulk properties in key development areas. ILS then offers them to interested buyers for recreation, development or resale.”

The system is 35 years old; it is a continuing process of repairs for leaks & cracked pipes. The volunteer workforce is on the golf course 3 to 4 days a week fixing these issues.



With the recent rain, the golf course has had an outbreak of weeds. During the first week of June, the golf course staff will be spraying the fairways & greens for goosegrass, nutgrass, crabgrass, chickweed, and etc. This will promote the growth of the native **bermuda grass**.
