Thieves also cut cable at one of the pumps that serve the golf course. We understand that these people cut the cable but left it lying on the ground. San Jacinto County Sheriff, James Walters advised that they have arrested a man from Trinity County. They have warrants for two other individuals.

On September 22, the Sheriff's Department, in conjunction with the DPS had a fly over Waterwood and they found the missing 4-Wheeler, valued at \$8,400.00, in the Pool Creek area. Thanks to the quick action by Sheriff Walters and his men these criminals may soon be off the streets.

DEAD TREES

With the drought this year, we can expect an increase of dead trees in Waterwood next year. This problem will attract a number of "contractors" wanting to cut down your dead trees.

Many local contractors want to place the cut limbs and tree trunks by the side of our streets and not carry them to the dump. The weekly pick up by the WIA maintenance crew includes branches and limbs only.

WIA can no longer burn tree trunks. Tree trunks must be hauled to the County dump. WIA disposes limbs by renting a chipping machine. When negotiating with your tree contractor, make it clear that he/she is responsible for hauling the trees off site.

Be careful who you deal with on your dead trees. Many contractors are not insured. If damage is done to your property or that of a neighbor in the act of removing dead trees, it could be your responsibility. Please ask for proof of insurance from the contractor. This proof is normally provided by the insurance agent in writing to you the customer.
